

ITAD Lifecycle Checklist

Phase 1: Foundation	
	Conduct a full audit of all IT assets.
	Draft a formal IT Asset Disposition (ITAD) policy.
	Define data destruction standards (e.g., NIST 800-88, IEEE).
	Assign a point person or team to manage the program.
Pha	ase 2: Partnership
	Find a certified ITAD vendor.
	Request quotes and service-level agreements (SLAs).
Pha	ase 3: Implementation
	Create a simple request system for asset pickup.
	Communicate the new process to all employees.
	Schedule your first pickup of retired assets.
	Review the first batch of reporting through vendor documentation.
Phase 4: Optimization	
	Schedule regular IT audits (quarterly or semi-annually)
	Analyze value recovery reports to track financial returns.
	Review and update ITAD policy and pickup frequency as needed.
